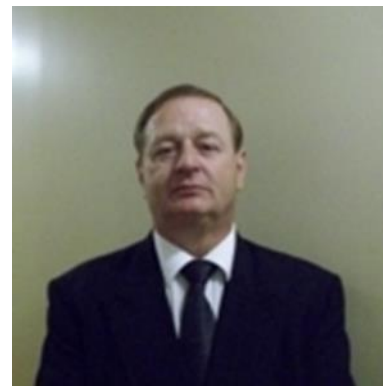

Courses Taught at Clear Creek Baptist Bible College

CBTH 1217 New Testament 1

New Testament Background and the Gospel of Mark This course is divided into two parts: a survey of the Second Temple period and background of the New Testament followed by a study of the Gospel of Mark. The study of the Gospel of Mark will cover the background, contents, purpose, and interpretation of the gospel with an emphasis on life application. Two Hours.

CBTH 1228 New Testament 2

Matthew and Luke: A study of the gospels of Matthew and Luke dealing with their background, contents, purpose, and interpretation with an emphasis on life application. Two hours.

CBTH 3217 New Testament 5

Romans and 1 - 2 Corinthians: A study of Romans and 1 -2 Corinthians dealing with an introduction to Pauline theology, their background, contents, purpose, and interpretation with an emphasis on life application. Two hours.

CBTH 3228 New Testament 6

Galatians, 1 - 2 Thessalonians & the Pastoral Epistles: 1 – 2 Timothy and Titus
A study of Galatians and 1 - 2 Thessalonians and the Pastoral Epistles dealing with their background, contents, purpose, and interpretation with an emphasis on life application. Two hours.

CBTH 3231 Biblical Geography

This course will be a systematic exploration of the major geographical regions of the biblical world in relation to their geography, economies, climates and biblical history. Two hours.

CBTH 3324 Systematic Theology 2

(Prerequisite: CBTH 3315) A study of man, his origin, character, fall, and the consequences of the fall. The doctrine of salvation, its plan, purpose and method, the person of Christ, work of Christ and application of that work. Three hours.

EMEV 3236 Evangelism in Acts

A study of the evangelistic motives, methods, and strategies of the early disciples and apostles of Jesus will be done with special interest in the work of the Holy Spirit in leading the Early Church to a priority of evangelism and church planting around the known world. Two hours.

EPAS 2226 Sermon on the Mount

Sermon on the Mount A verse – by - verse study of the teachings of Jesus as applicable to the contemporary situation. Two hours.

EPAS 2239 Biblical Language Intensive, Greek I

A study of the basic elements of the Greek noun system, definite article, adjectives, pronouns, prepositions, with an emphasis on grammar, vocabulary and some basic translation. Two hours.

EPAS 2249 Biblical Language Intensive, Greek II

(Prerequisite: EPAS 2239 or equivalent) A study of the basic elements of Greek indicative verbs and participles with continued emphasis on grammar, vocabulary, and some basic translation. Two hours.

EPAS 3210 Biblical Archeology

This course is taught in a seminar format with an overview of the principles, purpose, tools, history, various archaeological periods as well as practical disciplines of biblical archaeology. Two hours.

EPAS 3214 Gospel of John

An in-depth study with attention given to historical background, authorship, nature of composition, outline, theology and purpose. Two hours.

EPAS 3216 Biblical Language Intensive, Greek III

(Prerequisite: EPAS 2239, EPAS 2249 or equivalent) A study of the basic elements of Greek non-indicative and mi verbs with a continued emphasis on grammar and vocabulary and the use of the Graded Greek Reader. Two hours.

EPAS 4216 Biblical Language Intensive, Greek IV

(Prerequisites: EPAS 2239, EPAS 2249, EPAS 3216 or equivalent). This course will consist of the translation and interpretation of a passage or book of the New Testament as selected by the professor. Two hours.

EPAS 4241 Biblical Backgrounds

This course will be a 3 part study of the Biblical World: (1) the course will begin with a look at Old Testament people groups, cultures, religious practices, and major political leaders, institutions; (2) the course will present an overview of the Second Temple Period in relation to the people groups, cultures, and religious practices, major political leaders, institutions; (3), the final section will cover the New Testament people groups, cultures, religious practices, and major political groups and leaders. Two hours.

EPAS 4242 How We Got the Bible

A four part study of the English Bible: (1) the course will study the inspiration, production, canonization, and streams of textual evidence behind our Old Testament; (2) the course will analyze materials relevant to the inspiration, production, canonization, and streams of textual evidence behind our New Testament text; (3) the course will highlight a brief history of the struggle to obtain an English language Bible; (4) the course will evaluate some of the more recent English language translations. Two Hours.

EPAS 4251 Hebrews

An overview of the content, theology, and purpose of the book. Particular attention is given to the persecution setting and its relevance for the contemporary church. Two hours.

EPAS 4264 Romans

A systematic study of the theology and ethics of Paul. Two hours.

EPAS 4286 Parables

A comprehensive study and interpretation of the parables of Jesus. Two hours.

EPAS 4293 Study Tour of Israel

An on-site study of the geographical, historical, cultural, and archaeological background of the Old and New Testaments as well as modern current events in the land of Israel. Two hours.

EPAS 2217 Introduction to Biblical Languages

A study of the Hebrew and Greek languages touching on the alphabets, the noun and verbal systems, clauses, phrasing, word study roots, and methodologies, commentaries, and the formation of the Old and New Testament canons, and how to evaluate translations. (Two hours)

New Testament Orientation 1 (2007 – 2010)

A general introduction to the New Testament Gospels, General Epistles, and Revelation, emphasizing matters of text, canon, authorship, date, authorial purpose, and theme development. Also, a special introduction, involving current issues of criticism and interpretation, such as the

synoptic problem. The general principles of interpretation (hermeneutics) will be introduced as well as the special principles concerning parables, symbols and types, and prophecy.

New Testament Orientation 2 (2007-2010)

A continuation of NBST 515 with a general emphasis and special introduction of Acts and the Pauline Epistles. The study of hermeneutics will continue with emphasis upon word meaning, figures of speech, and other linguistic matters.

Biblical Hermeneutics Course (since 2010)

An advanced course in hermeneutics including a study of the history of interpretation, both biblical and extra-biblical, and an examination of the current status of various interpretive approaches to the Scriptures.

The Book of Hebrews as elective (2009)

An intensive exegetical-theological study of Hebrews. The course includes an investigation of the doctrines of Christ, especially His mediatorship and priesthood, the doctrine of salvation as it relates to the problem of perseverance and apostasy, and the use of the Old Testament in this book. After a brief study of the introductory issues of authorship, date, audience, background, destination and purpose, etc., a sections-by-section/verse-by-verse exposition of the text will follow.

DOCTOR OF MINISTRY MENTORSHIP

Overview The Doctor of Ministry is a 30-credit hour program designed to enhance the knowledge, skills, and research ability of people who are currently engaged in ministry. The program is built upon the foundation offered by the Master of Divinity degree or a graduate-level equivalent. Applicants for admission to the Doctor of Ministry must have at least three (3) years of ministry experience.

An exploration of New Testament literature, history, and faith to help students understand the teachings of Jesus and the early church and develop and apply Christian values in contemporary life. Credit, 3 hours. Offered each fall and spring semester.

Exploring the Old Testament

The course focuses on one section of the Old Testament writings. For the purposes of the course, the Old Testament has been broken into the Pentateuch, history of Israel, Prophets, and Psalms

and Wisdom. Within a two-year cycle of the course, at least one offering of the course would cover each of the four sections of the Old Testament. A student pursuing the Biblical Studies track of the M.A. in Christian Studies may take the course three times as long as each offering focuses on a different section of the Old Testament, but to meet the requirements of the Biblical Studies track a student must take RELG 632 Focused Study of the New Testament at least once to provide a more balanced in-depth study of the Bible.

(Prerequisite: RELG 531 Old Testament Survey I, RELG 532 Old Testament Survey II, or permission of instructor)

Johannine Writings

An in-depth examination of one section of the New Testament. The four sections the course cycles through are the Synoptic Gospels, the Life and Letters of Paul, the Johannine Writings, and the General Epistles and Revelation.

Master's Level: Developed for Online

MMOL 533 New Testament Survey 1

The course provides an introduction to the Gospels of the New Testament. The course provides an historical, literary, and theological examination of the books. Students will learn about the various analytical methods used in studying these books and the major issues in the formation and interpretation of the books. Students will also examine the content and theology of the books. Offered 1st Bi-Term each fall.

MMOL 534 New Testament Survey 2

The course provides an introduction to the Book of Acts, the letters of Paul, the general letters, and the Book of Revelation in the New Testament. The course provides an historical, literary, and theological examination of the books and sections. Students will learn about the various analytical methods used in studying these books and the major issues in the formation and interpretation of the books. Students will also examine the content and theology of the books. Credit, 3 hours. Offered 1st Bi-Term each spring.

MMOL 642 Evangelistic Preaching

The course focuses on developing the necessary skills to prepare and deliver an evangelistic sermon that leads individuals to find faith in Christ. While the course focuses on preaching, the course also helps develop skills in extending an effective invitation.

MMOL 632 Focused Study on the Synoptic Gospels

The course focuses on one section of the New Testament writings. For the purposes of the course, the New Testament has been broken into the Synoptic Gospels, the writings of Paul, the Johannine Gospel and letters, and the General Epistles and Revelation. Within a two-year cycle of the course, at least one offering of the course would cover each of the four sections of the New Testament. A student pursuing the Biblical Studies track of the M.A. in Christian Studies may take the course three times as long as each offering focuses on a different section of the New Testament, but to meet the requirements of the Biblical Studies track a student must take MMOL 631 at least once to provide a more balanced in-depth study of the Bible. Prerequisite: MMOL 533, MMOL 534, or permission of instructor. Offered 1st Bi-Term in the summer of even-numbered years.

MMOL 632 Focused Study of the New Testament: John's Writings

MMOL 631 Focused Study on the Psalms and Wisdom Literature

The course focuses on one section of the Old Testament writings. For the purposes of the course, the Old Testament has been broken into the Pentateuch, history of Israel, Prophets, and **Psalms and Wisdom**. Within a two-year cycle of the course, at least one offering of the course would cover each of the four sections of the Old Testament. A student pursuing the Biblical Studies track of the M.A. in Christian Studies may take the course three times as long as each offering focuses on a different section of the Old Testament, but to meet the requirements of the Biblical Studies track a student must take RELG 632 Focused Study of the New Testament at least once to provide a more balanced in-depth study of the Bible.

(Prerequisite: RELG 531 Old Testament Survey I, RELG 532 Old Testament Survey II, or permission of instructor)

MMOL 644 Developing an Evangelistic Church

The course focuses on developing the minister's skills in leading his or her church to understand the importance of evangelism and to engage in more effective evangelistic outreach and discipleship.

MMOL 335 Developing Christian Leaders

An examination of the basic skills required for effective Christian leadership. The focus of the course will be on identifying leadership skills and methods of developing church leaders.
